

ABOUT this PRODUCT

This resource contains 8 reading comprehension and fluency passages presented in 2 versions and followed by a True/ False sort.

The students will have to:

- read each text 3 times and color a star after each reading (for fluency)
- answer text-based questions and color the evidence in the text (in the first version)
- write and answer their own questions about the important details in the text (in the 2nd version)
- cut, sort, and paste sentences that use details from the story on a True/ False chart

I used a narrow font to fit a passage and three comprehension questions on the same page and make it easier for the kids to work with the text.

Differentiation is easy: use the 2nd version to challenge your higher 2^{nd} graders.
